

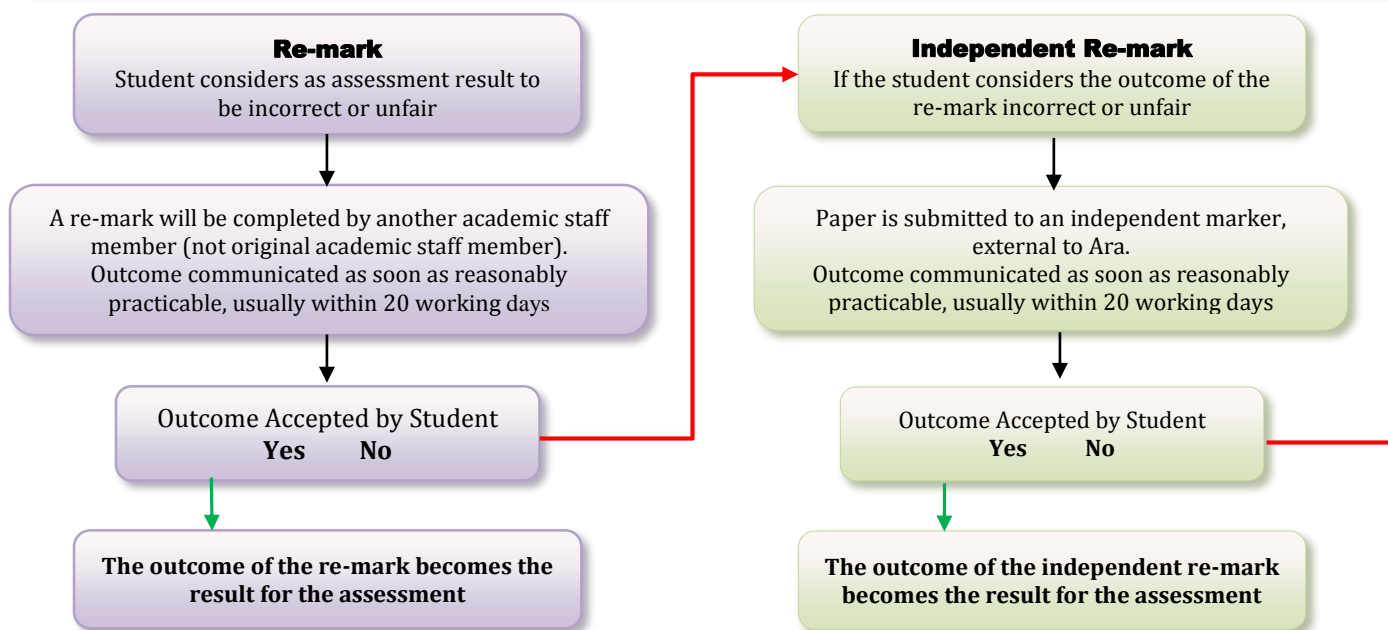
Reconsiderations and Appeals

Reconsiderations

If a student considers the marking of an assessment to be incorrect or unfair, the steps below are to be followed.

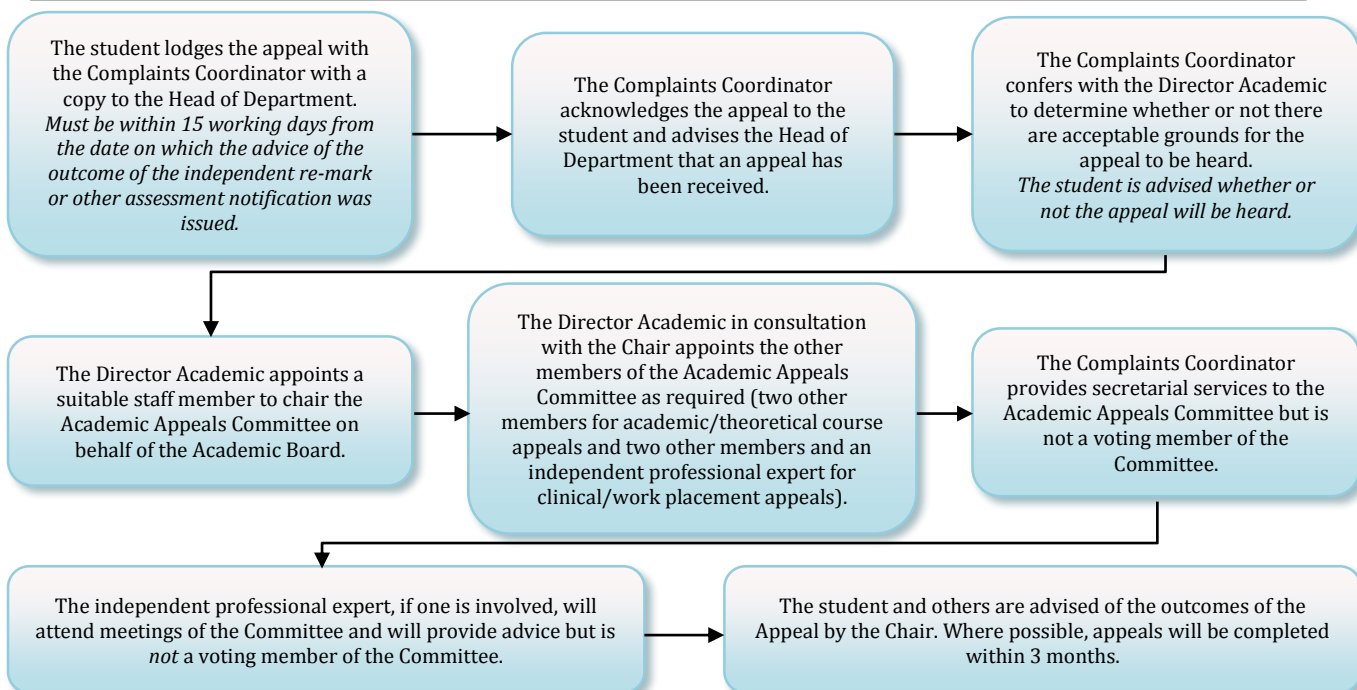
Discussion:

Student discusses the assessment result with the relevant academic staff member who may then consult the Programme Manager/Leader Head of Department. The student's request for discussion must be lodged within 10 working days of the marks/result/course outcome being communicated to the student. Note: Requests for Recounts are dealt with in the Department.



Appeals

If the student/s considers the outcome of the independent re-mark or equivalent review of a result to be incorrect or unfair they may appeal to the Academic Appeals Committee. Grounds for an appeal must be that additional new and significant information has become available or there was an irregularity in the assessment process or in the process used to reach the decisions or an independent re-mark is not appropriate or practicable because the result being appealed involves the assessment of competence in a clinical/work placement.



Reconsiderations and Appeals Involving Clinical / Work Place

If the student considers the judgements made by one or more professionals (e.g. clinical lecturers, workplace assessors) in assessing competence in a clinical/work place to be incorrect or unfair, they may appeal to the Academic Appeals Committee. Grounds for an appeal must be that additional new and significant information has become available or there was an irregularity in the assessment process or processes used to reach a decision. The following also applies:
