First generation Samoan Afamasaga Feleti Pesefea didn't know what he wanted to do when he finished high school but he's gone on to achieve great things at Ara-Te Pūkenga and his family couldn't be prouder.

Feleti started out with a free Pacific Trades Training course in plumbing and worked in that field for a few years before deciding music was his passion. So he returned to Ara-Te Pūkenga to study a Bachelor of Music, followed by a Master in Creative Practice. He thrived among other passionate musos and excelled in his studies. He also helped create the Pacific Island Students of Ara (PISA) group and won the Eke Panuku Pacific Supreme Award.

Now, Feleti is a music teacher, inspiring the next generation of young creative New Zealanders.

Māori are graduating with higher-level qualifications in greater numbers than ever before and blazing a trail for those following in their footsteps.

Jade Pamata-Ma'anaima is a prime example. She graduated from Ara-Te Pūkenga with a degree in construction management specialising in quantity surveying. She's the first person in her family to gain a degree and wants her success – in a nontraditional STEM area – to be an inspiration to other Māori.

Her goal is to get more Māori at the decision-making table so they can be role models for the next generation.
